- ► You learn a foreign language, while living in and having formal lessons in the home of a language teacher.

You cannot learn to swim or to play the drums from a book or watching videos you have to practice the sport or the instrument continually on a daily basis to improve your skills. In the same way, you have to practice and use the language you are learning with native speakers to improve your skills.

What It Is; What It Is Not.

- It IS an excellent way to learn another language, in privacy, and without the fear of making mistakes in front of others.
- It IS the ideal foreign language learning situation: daily practice in a friendly environment.
- It IS the best and most effective use of one's time for learning a foreign language.
- It IS the best way to become completely immersed in and absorb the culture and traditions of another country.
- It IS suitable for ALL age groups.
- It IS suitable for ALL levels of proficiency and ability.
- It IS NOT for those looking for miracles or who want a "quick fix."
- It IS **NOT** for those who are looking for someone to act as a tourist guide or looking for hosts to serve as alternates to hotels and restaurants.

Your Program.

- You are unique, your language requirements are unique. Your program will focus specifically on what you need to or want to accomplish.
- You learn the language you are studying naturally, as you learned your own language at your own speed.
- Mistakes are identified early and corrected before they become bad habits. As the host teacher identifies areas of weakness, exercises are created to focus on and eradicate the problem. It is not possible to do this in a classroom situation.
- You will always have someone to assist in learning proper pronunciation.
- Living with a host teacher or a well educated host means that you will be guided and corrected, not only during the formal language lessons but at all times. Your friends and / or colleagues hesitate to correct you for fear of offending you. Your host teacher will correct you.
- You are matched with host teachers who share some of your interests. Conversation comes much more easily if you are interested in the topic being discussed.

Before you begin to read "To Answer Questions...

• For those who are apprehensive about "living with strangers..."

- We work with very carefully selected hosts. We do not work with hosts that commercially "rent rooms" to tourists. This is a language and cultural program.
- In each region, there are Regional / Local Organ-

izers who have personally visited all the homes / host teachers. Just as you may have preferences for a host (non-smoker, all female home, vegetarian, ad infinitum), hosts also have preferences.



• You will not be "abandoned" in a homestay, stranded if you have ques-

tions or problems. There is the Local / Regional Organizer who is always on call. You will have at least two emergency numbers, one of which is a 24 / 7 number.

• Host teachers and homes are selected to match educational level, cultural and other mutual interests, standard of living, proximity to sports activities at the formula of the standard of living.

ties, etc. of each student.

• In other words, the host teachers and homes in the Live It To Learn It program provide a higher standard of living



and better educational level than what is usually offered by the average family accepting foreign students.

• If you are really apprehensive about living in the home of strangers or are travelling with someone who is or for some other reason does not need or want lodging, please read the information in the "To Answer Questions" section about the

"Almost" 100% Total Language Immersion Program.

• We offer different categories / levels of comfort.

You live in the home of a local host teacher. You meet real local people. You will be placed with hosts who share some of your interests. It will make your language learning experience that much more interest-

ing. The host teacher is well educated in and has an excellent understanding of his/her own language and culture. Members of the family are well educated and well in-



formed about their own culture.

Standard - meets the needs of most participants.

 Private Bathrooms are available, but there may be an additional cost. It depends on which hosts are available at

the time. It can vary by country and region.

• At no time will you be placed in a situation where you are sharing the only bathroom with many family members. However, you may be sharing it with one or two family members.



• Homes, especially older homes, in other countries just do not have as many bathrooms as do homes in the United.States. It is a cultural difference, not a reflection of the quality of the homestay or standard of living.

Standard Plus.

•Private Bathroom is guaranteed.

Superior / Business.

- Private bathroom is guaranteed.
- This category is primarily for executives and

professionals who want to improve their language skills and vocabulary in a specific area.

• If you request it, you will be able to meet people in your profession or business. If being introduced to others in your business or professions is important, please put this in writing in advance.




Luxury.

- Private Bathroom is guaranteed.
- While open to all, the Luxury Category is primarily for those (active or retired) who, for professional or social reasons, prefer to meet people with similar interests and lifestyles.
- Until now, more affluent travelers have hesitated about getting involved in a language study homestay situation. The average host family accepting "students" in their home in the traditional language study homestay program does not live at the standard to which the more affluent traveler is accustomed.

The alternative has been to stay in an expensive, luxury hotel that is very impersonal.

- This is a different lifestyle. It may be a luxurious modern apartment, it may be an old "maison particulier." It may be in the center of a city, it may be way out in the country. You can choose.
- If you request Luxury because you want to be guaranteed the most modern conveniences, electronic gadgets and maid service, this program is not for you. In



- You will be given extra personal attention. The cost for this category takes into consideration the fact that you are staying with hosts who ordinarily do not have people they do not know living as guests in their home.
- Although private bathrooms are available in all countries, the Luxury Category may not be available at all times in all countries.

Additional Comments

Families:

- Your family is welcome. Please be realistic. The more people involved, the more difficult it will be to place all of you in the same home and the more time is needed to do so.
- Costs given are for One or Two Adults in a homestay. If there are more... or if children are involved, please give us full details in advance so we can give you the correct cost.

Changes in Plans (please read carefully):

• Please make sure we have all the details in advance (allergies, interests, bathroom preferences, number of participants, number of bedrooms, dates,

- destination, again, ad infinitum). There may be a charge to make changes.
- Making changes is more difficult than it may seem. If you change the date, even by one day, we may have to change the host family. If you need an

additional bedroom, we may have to change the host family. Changing from Private Bathroom Preferred to Private Bathroom Essential, is another host. Same thing - smoking, nonsmoking, allergies. It is not as easy as requesting another room in a big hotel; it is much more involved.



• If you request a change after arrival because of something that was not mentioned previously

(and put in writing) and the change cannot be arranged, and you choose not to continue with the program, there will be no refunds. Please plan in advance and put all requests in writing.

Costs:

- In many cases (depending on the country), even with language lessons, the Live It To Learn It program will be less expensive than a hotel. However, the program is not for those who are looking for "cheap lodging."
- In order for the program to work smoothly, a number of people have to be involved in setting up each homestay and that is figured into the cost.
- Costs given are for the Standard Category. If you have questions on the costs for the other categories, request them.

Activities Program:

For those who want more than just daily activities with their language lessons, an Activities Program can be arranged. You can go sightseeing with your host, research your genealogy, go to the beach, shop, hike, bike, etc. The Activities Program refers to activities that require travel out of the host's immediate area. Separately, we will be able to suggest possibilities for different countries and regions; not all countries and regions.



Host's Knowledge of English:

• In the 100% Total Language Immersion Program, you are supposed to hear and speak only the language you are learning. If you are at the Beginning

Level or do not feel comfortable with this, please let us know in advance and you will be placed with a host teacher that knows English.

• The fact is that many / most educated people throughout the world have studied English. Having studied a foreign language and speaking it well or fluently are two different things. If you request an English speaking host teacher; your host teacher will know English, but not be fluent.







Homesickness:

• Students of all ages suffer from it. It

takes many forms. Sometimes it happens at the very beginning; sometimes it does not happen until the second or third week. It rarely never happens.

- Please make sure that you yourself (adult) realize it will happen to you and / or that younger students understand that it will happen to them. It is OK to be homesick, it is OK to admit it and know that it will pass.
- The less contact (telephone / e-mail) students of all ages have with parents, relatives, friends and business associates, the better. This is especially important during the first few days. The more contact with those "back home," the longer it takes to adjust to the total immersion experience and the less effective it might be.

Executives & Professionals:

There is much more detailed information on this topic at the end of the next section.

• The 100% Total Language Immersion method has been a favorite of Senior Level Executives and Pro-

fessionals in Europe for over 30 years.

- Special vocabularies—to meet the needs of many industries and professions are available.
- •Business and professional contacts may be arranged. Text materials and social and business contacts will be appropriate to each participant's situation

Senior Citizens with Health Considerations: All Seniors are welcome. There are more comments on this topic at the end of the next section.

Younger Students:

There is much more detailed information on this topic at the end of the next section.

• Younger students will be placed in homes that have been carefully selected and are considered age appropriate. These homes frequently, but not always, have children the age of the student. If there

are no children of the same age in the home, there are children of similar age in the immediate vicinity.

Younger students might be encouraged to join local sports or other type of activity club to increase their

contacts with children their age. It will depend on the specific situation.

• All language learning materials and daily activities with the host will be age appropriate for the country in which the child is living.





Most Important:

It is a foreign language and cultural program.

You are there to experience the differences, to compare cultures, not for the experience to duplicate what you have at home. You must be able to adjust to a dif-



ferent way of life. Be open to new ideas. There is no universal right way to do things; there are many right ways to do things.

The following is more information on topics covered in the Introduction and answers to some questions you might have. They are presented in no particular order. If you have any other questions, please call. We will be happy to discuss the program with you.

Information on:

- ► The "ALMOST" 100% Total Language Immersion is at the end of this section.
- ▶ Parents with Children is at the end of this section.
- ► 100% Total Language Immersion for Executives & Professionals is at the end of this section.
- ▶ 100% Total Language Immersion for Children / Younger Students (8 to 18) is at the end of this section.

Abbreviations.

In this section, and in the Terms & Conditions, we use abbreviations. This is done to save space. If we save space, the letters can be larger and easier to read. 100-TLI = 100% Total Language Immersion; R / LO = Regional / Local Organizer.

Use Of The Word "Student."

- •"100%-TLI" uses the word "student" throughout the explanation of the program. Everyone, no matter what his / her age, is considered a student.
- •The above paragraph applies to top level executives as well. You are there because of what you have to learn, not what you have already accomplished.

Background Information.

●Live It To Learn It® / 100-TLI is both a very intensive language learning program and a cultural immersion program. It is excellent for improving your foreign language skills in a limited of time. You study and practice the language in a relaxed and

natural setting. You live in the home of your language teacher, hearing only the language you are studying... and are totally isolated from hearing your own language. In addition to your formal language lessons, mealtime conversation, all activities, television programs, social contacts, etc. are all in the language you are learning.





- •The most common
- criticism of foreign language study programs in general is that students can and do speak their own language with friends when not in class. The 100-TLI eliminates this possibility.
- •You will be placed with a teacher who shares some of your interests or hobbies. You learn another language more quickly when you use it to read about or discuss, in a relaxed atmosphere, hobbies and other activities you enjoy. When a conversation focuses on an area of interest to you music, art, sports, cooking, antiques, gardening, theater, etc. you are much more involved in the conversation and are more eager to participate and more willing to take "language risks" to express your ideas.
- •100-TLI appeals to both "linguaphiles" and to those for whom learning a foreign language is not the way they would prefer to spend their time. It appeals to those who enjoy learning foreign languages as well as experiencing a foreign culture first hand. It appeals to all who need to improve language skills ei-

ther professionally or for the classroom, to those who need to pass proficiency exams, to professors and teachers who need to improve conversational skills and to increase oral proficiency, to Seniors who want to learn a foreign language, and to serious younger language students (see Younger Students).

Who Can Participate?

- •Almost everyone. It is a program for those who need to study a foreign language and for those who just enjoy learning languages.
- •You must be in relatively good health. Any illness, dietary restrictions, or handicap you have must not impose a burden on the host teacher.
- Couples and friends may participate as well as parents with children.

Age Of Participants.

- •The "100%-TLI" Program is appropriate for and open to all age groups. As the R / LO know the personal preferences and capabilities of host teachers, suitable placements can be made for any student of any age.
- •Senior Citizens are definitely welcome; there is no upper age limit. The minimum age for unaccompanied children is usually 10 to 12 years. See "The Younger Student."

Present Level of Proficiency / Linguistic Ability.

- •The "100%-TLI" Program is suitable for all levels of proficiency from Absolute Beginners to Near Native Speaker.
- •It is suitable for slow learners as well as gifted language students. There is no need for the less talented language student to feel shy or inhibited in a large class of different ages and abilities. There is no need for the gifted language student to be held back by slower learners.

Number Of Students In the Home of the Host-Teacher.

- The "100%-TLI" Program places only one person in each homestay, unless people request to study together (husband & wife, friends, parents & children, etc.). You cannot request to be matched up with someone you do not know to get the lower cost for two people studying together. When students come together, class hours are shared.
- We also make arrangements for small groups. Participants would be placed in the same vicinity with different host teachers.

Program Options (see Categories Available)

Prerequisites.

- Desire to learn another language. You do not have to be a good language student to participate, but you must want to learn the language. You do not have to have a flair for languages, but you must take the language lessons seriously.
- Motivation to act on the desire to learn. Wanting to learn and being motivated to learn it are different. You have to make the effort.

Regional / Local Organizer (R / LO).

- •Every region is supervised by a resident R / LO. It is that person's responsibility to select the host teacher, monitor the progress of each student and to make sure that the experience is both pleasant and successful.
- •The R / LO is on call in case of emergency and
- checks in with the student during his / her stay to make sure that everything is going as planned, and to resolve any minor problems before they become major ones. This person speaks English in addition to his / her native language, if it is not English.
- ●In case a problem arises before the R / LO contacts the student, the student should contact the R / LO right away.





- •In regions with a lower demand for the program or in countries where less commonly taught languages are spoken, the R / LO and host teacher may be the same person. In that case, you will be given instructions before the program starts on what to do should a problem arise.
- The R / LO will respond as soon as is possible, in most cases immediately.

Comments On Not Being Permitted To Speak English Or Other Native Language.

The following will set your mind at ease about being prohibited from speaking your own language.

•In case of emergency, you are obviously permitted

to speak your own language. The R / LO in each area can and does speak English well. This person, or an assistant, is always on call for emergencies. If your native language is not English and the R / LO does not speak your language, and you need to speak to someone in your own language in an emergency, some one will be called.

• In a medical emergency, you are definitely allowed to speak English.

If You Are Not Happy With The Host.

Most matches work very well. The hosts chosen for the "100%-TLI" Program enjoy having people in their homes and are very accommodating. However, if the match does not work out, and this sometimes happens, contact the R / LO and another host and home will be found for you as soon as is possible. This will be done discreetly. However, as soon as possible does not and cannot always mean immediately.

Organization Of The 100% Total Language Immersion Program.

- •The "100%-TLI" Program is one of the foreign language study options offered by Louise Harber / FLSAS. FLSAS has been offering foreign language study and cultural immersion programs abroad for over 35 years.
- •For the "100%-TLI" Programs in many countries, FLSAS works with the organization that pioneered the 100% Total Language Immersion concept in 1979. In other countries, the "100%-TLI" Programs are
- coordinates with foreign language institutes or local organizers.

 The R / LO are selected by the Directors of each program and

the host teachers are selected by

•In each country, the actual program might change slightly to accommodate cultural differences. Two examples are: 1) in France public transportation is excellent and students can and are expected to explore on their own; 2) in "the Americas" transportation is not that efficient and exploring on one's own becomes more of a challenge.


Activity Programs.


•In Mexico and in some other countries (the

- "Americas"), in addition to daily type activities with the host and / or teacher, excursions and / or cultural activities are available to participants at no additional charge if they wish to join them. It is optional; it is up to the student. You will be experiencing more of the country and learning more about its culture; however, the trade off is that you will probably hear English on the excursions.
- •In other countries, in addition to daily type activities with the host and / or teacher, additional activities may be available. What is available will depend upon country, region and time of year.

Daily Worksheet / Report On Lessons And What Is Covered In The Lessons.

- •In most countries, both host teacher and student will complete and return a Daily Worksheet. The
- Worksheet details the duration and content of lessons and any other comments. This should be signed each day by the student and the host teacher.







Studying For Proficiency Exams.

- •If you are studying a language because you have to pass a formal proficiency exam, a special program can be prepared to focus on what you need to cover for the exam. There may be an additional charge depending upon the material to be covered.
- •If at all possible, a sample of a past exam or a copy of the curriculum for a particular course should be submitted in advance.

Special Vocabularies / Interests.

•If you request to be placed with a host teacher with a knowledge of a specific vocabulary (social work, economics, nursing, business, etc.), you will be placed with someone knowledgeable, though not necessarily an expert, in the particular field. Your host teacher in all probability will not be a social worker, economist, engineer, nurse, etc., but some-

one with contacts (friends, relatives or colleagues) who are in those fields.

•The primary purpose of the "100%-TLI" Program is foreign language instruction. Even though business, legal, medical, import-export vocabularies are available, the 100-TLI is not, in any way, represented to be any other type of course.

100% Total Language Immersion. Is This The Best Method Of Learning A Foreign Language?

•Everyone learns languages differently. The 100% Total Language Immersion method is definitely very effective, especially for those who are hesitant to speak out in a classroom situation and those who have a limited amount of time to study. However, you have to know what works well for you. Some people believe they learn best in a classroom situa-

tion, learning from hearing other people's mistakes; others have no interest in hearing those other than native speakers speaking the language correctly.



•No refunds will be given should you decide, after the program

starts, that you do not like this method. We will do everything to make the experience work for you, but you cannot cancel once the program has started.

Best Time Of Year.

There is no best time of year. The summer (June, July and August) is the time of year when there is the greatest demand for this program since many people like to combine foreign language study with their vacation. During the summer, it is more difficult to match students with host teachers of similar interests when applications are received at the last moment.

Advance Notice.

The more advance notice you give, the easier it will be to match you with someone who shares some of your interests or meets other requirements you may have. In most cases and depending upon the country, programs can be arranged on short notice. If you register at the last moment, you must be flexible as to region, interests, etc.

Length Of Stay.

•Minimum stay is usually one week. No maximum;

you can choose as many weeks as you want.

- •Super-Intensive Weekend Immersion Programs may also be arranged in some locations at certain times of the year.
- •The average stay is two (2) to three (3) weeks because most people do not have more time. Extended stays of 8 to 10 weeks or even longer may be arranged for those who have the time.
- For those with very limited time, even one week is intensive enough to assure progress.
- •Please be realistic
 - •If you are an Absolute Beginner and study for only one week, you will definitely learn, but not as much as if you stayed longer. However, you must begin sometime and there



is no time like the present. You will learn much more than you will if you do not study for that one week... and you can always continue your studies at a later date. If you wait till you have four (4) weeks or six (6) weeks, you will most probably never do it.

•Note: Even if you are not a beginner, do not set unrealistic goals. You will learn quickly, but you will not experience a miracle. Any organization that "guarantees" remarkable results in a week or two weeks is just not telling the truth.

Beginners / Absolute Beginners.

- •Absolute Beginners (no previous knowledge or study whatsoever) or Beginners may participate. It will be challenging, and you should be prepared to be frustrated at times, but you will make rapid progress. You might think you are not making progress, but you will be making very rapid progress for a Beginner.
- •If you do plan to go as an Absolute Beginner or Beginner, it is helpful to build up your vocabulary before you begin your studies. Concentrate on the vocabulary of subjects that interest you. If you do not have the time to build up your vocabulary before you go, do not let that stop you. You can do that when you start to learn the language.

Name & Address Of Host Teacher.

•Before you go, you will be given the name and address and telephone number of your host teacher. You will also receive a brief description of the host's home, interests and family members. You are welcome to call and speak with the host, if you want to.

• During June, July and August, and occasionally at other times of the year, it is possible, but not probable, that the name and address of the host teacher will not come until one (1) week to ten (10) days before the program starts. The region will be confirmed in advance, but the name of the host teacher will not be given right away.

Effectiveness.

- •For most students the "100%-TLI" Program, the only true 100% Total Language Immersion Program is the most effective use of one's time in the study of a foreign language.
- •Even a one week stay is very, very effective. However, no reputable program guarantees results in one or two weeks. Learning a foreign language is like learning a sport or learning to play a musical instrument; each person acquires skills at different rate.

Your Lessons.

- •Your studies are carefully monitored.
- •Even though the program takes place in a home, unless something else is agreed upon, the actual language lessons are formal lessons with textbooks or other materials selected by the host teacher or brought by the student.
- You may choose to take Activity Lessons instead of or in addition to formal language lessons.
- •As mealtime conversation, television programs and social contacts and activities are all in the language you are learning, the lessons and the learning process never stops.

Daily Schedule.

- •Lessons are usually in the morning. Lessons are usually held Monday to Friday. Exceptions can be made. They should be stated in writing and agreed upon in advance.
- •Lessons can be arranged around a student's sightseeing schedule as long as the host teacher'schedule can accommodate the request. This is a first and foremost a foreign language learning program, not a tourism / sightseeing program.
- •If you choose to divide your lessons into formal "sit -down" lessons and out of classroom activity lessons, you and the host teacher will work out the schedule.

Typical Day (If There Is Such A Thing).

• After breakfast with your host, you will have your

- scheduled language and / activity lessons.
- •After lessons and lunch with your host, you may explore the town or city or area or join an activity or sports club or visit a museum, etc.
- •According to your age and proficiency level, your host teacher may send you into town with a language project to complete and to later discuss during a more formal lesson. These

projects will always involve you speaking with local people.

•Other afternoons, a couple of times each week, you may be taken by your host to places of mutual interest - art galleries, sports facilities,



shopping, club meetings, public gardens, golf course, tennis courts, horse-back riding, movies, theater, etc., where you will have the opportunity to socialize with native speakers. Or you may go on a short excursion / visit.

•In the evening, you return to dinner and relaxed conversation, hopefully discussing the events of your day.

What is Expected of You, the Student?

•You should consider yourself a friend who has come to visit the host family. You should not consider yourself a guest in a hotel. This does not mean, in any way, that you are required to do "chores." It just means that you participate in the daily life of the

host and his / her family as you would do at home... or maybe even a little bit more than you would at home.

•Do not rely on the host to be the first one to make conversation.



Even if your language ability is almost non-existent, try to make conversation as well. It is possible.

- •The job of the host-teacher is to teach you a foreign language. He / she is not there to entertain you. You should make every effort to adjust, get out and do things, meet people, etc.
- •Watching television and listening to the radio, especially commercials, are very good ways to learn a foreign language. However, you should not travel to a foreign country to spend your time in front of a television, and not get out and explore.

Your Free Time.

- Everyone goes into the "100%-TLI" Program with a different idea of what he / she wants to do. Some students want to spend the entire time with the host. Others want freedom to go off and explore. You may do whatever you want when the formal lessons are over. There are exceptions to this last sentence for minors.
- •When submitting the Application Form, let us know how you would prefer to spend your day. Knowing this in advance will help the host to be better prepared for you stay.

E-Mail And Phone Calls And The Foreign Language Learning Experience.

If you are in continual contact in English (or other native language) by e-mail or by phone with your family, friends and relatives, you defeat the purpose of the 100-TLI experience. Try to keep the contacts to a minimum. Try to go "cold turkey."

Starting Dates.

- Dates may be arranged to meet your schedule. Programs usually start and end on Sunday. Starting Dates may be arranged all year round.
- •Yes, it can be done at Christmas and New Year's and Easter. In some countries there may be an additional charge for these dates.

Number Of Lessons Per Week.

- •You have a choice of 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 lessons, or more (if requested), of scheduled language lessons per week. Lessons are 55 minutes. Language lessons can either be formal with textbooks and other materials, or more informal, taking place outside the classroom. A student requesting 20 lessons or more per week will probably have a combination of both. If you have a preference for one or the other, please let us know in advance.
- •Two people who come together will share the number of lessons per week. If they are both on the same level, most likely they will share all the lessons. If they are on different levels, the number of lessons will be divided. If there is any preference for one person to have more lessons than the other, please agree on this in advance of arrival.
- •From mid-May to mid-September, the 10 lessons per week option might not be available.

Qualifications Of Host-Teachers.

• All host teachers are carefully selected by the Re-

- gional / Local Organizer or the Director of a language institute.
- •Many 100-TLI host teachers are teachers by profession. Others, all college graduates, are chosen because of their educational level and enthusiasm for teaching and their knowledge of their own language and of the contemporary culture of their country and region.
- •Since the demand for teachers is greatest during the summer months, many are teachers in the university

or school system of their country during the academic year.

•The cultural level of hosts is well above average. Host / teachers and their family members have a wide variety of interests.



•The following might happen in every country, but it it more likely to happen in "the Americas." Students may stay at the home of one host family which meets all the criteria for the homestay part - interests, educational level, etc. - and have the actual teacher come into the home for the lessons. This situation would occur when there is a very good teacher who, for any number of reasons, cannot have students in his / her home (temporarily or permanently); and there is an educated host family who has a very nice home but,

for any number of reasons, does not have a family member who can teach you at the time you will be there. This situation might occur when someone enrolls at the last moment, or when a student is a Beginner or Very Advanced. It also might happen if you request a Private Bathroom, Special Vocabulary, or when two people come together but want separate teachers. You will be




informed of this situation in advance of your arrival. You will receive the background on both the host family and the teacher. You are not receiving anything less than promised. The hosts will be well educated and capable of fulfilling all other requirements of a host teacher, including correcting you, other than being the ones to actually give you the lessons.

Countries / Regions Available and / or Special Requests.

• The available countries / regions are on a separate

list. Additional countries / regions are added each year. Some countries and regions are not always available.

•"Special Request" Countries /Regions. It may be possible to make arrangements for locations that are not presently available. If you want to study in one of these locations, you must submit the application with a \$500.00 deposit at least six (6) weeks in advance. If we cannot



make the arrangements in the location of your choice, the deposit will be applied to study in a location that is available. If the program can be set-up in the location you want on the dates you want and you decide you do not want to attend, the \$500.00 Deposit will not be refunded. The Application Form for "Special Requests" will not be processed without a \$500.00 deposit. No Refunds will be given for Cancellations of a "Special Request" location if payment in full has been received. Postponements of up to one calendar year will be permitted.

Regions.

- •When a description such as "the Black Forest" or "Tuscany" is used, it is understood that it means an area of the country. The definition of the area is more or less the same as that used in a Tourist Guide. When the description is "Paris Region" or "Stuttgart Region" it means within an approximate 25-mile radius of the city in question (with the exception of London).
- •Please list choice of regions in the order that they are of interest. Unless you apply less than four (4) weeks before the Starting Date (six (6) weeks before the Starting Date for programs during June, July, August and the beginning of September), you usually will get your first choice. This is provided that your first choice is not an "Special Request" region.
- •To those making the host assignment, it is just as important to match interests and a host teacher who is very good with a specific level of language proficiency or a specific age group as it is to place students in a specific city or region. This is especially true with younger students and Absolute Beginners.
- •"Special Requests." Since new regions are being opened, an area you list as "Special Request" might be available. However, if you list a "Special Request" you absolutely must list a second and third choice. "100%-TLI" has no obligation to look for a

host teacher in a "Special Request" region.

• For Those Who Want A Specific Region.

•From mid-September to mid-May, requests will be taken for specific regions (as long as the region is one listed, not an "Special Request."), and if the request is made more than four (4) weeks in advance.
•From mid-May to mid-September, every effort will be made to honor a request for specific region (not an "Special Request"), but it cannot be guaranteed.

• For Those Who Want A Specific Small City or Town.

•It is almost impossible to guarantee a specific small city or small town in a region at any time of the year.

• For Those Who Want More Than One Region or More Than One Host Teacher.

- •If you stay for three (3) or four (4) weeks or longer, you may request to be in two different regions to get to know the culture and traditions of different parts of the country and get used to listening to different accents, or with different host teachers in the same region to get to know the customs and traditions of different families.
- •If you choose more than one host teacher, you must realize that each host teacher is different. You will

like certain things about one host teacher and certain things about the other host teacher. Do not expect to have the same experience with each host teacher.



Your Background In Foreign Languages.

In addition to the Proficiency Assessment / Level evaluation, please provide information on previous foreign language studies. If you have never studied a foreign language before, that is perfectly all right.

Allergies.

- •Please make sure you list all allergies. For example... In France, especially, most homes have dogs and cats. Those with severe pollen allergies should think twice about going to Costa Rica. Even if you are in a home with non-smokers, you will probably find cigarette and cigar smoke in restaurants, public transportation, etc.
- If you do suffer from any allergy, make sure you go with the proper medication.
- Absolutely no refunds will be given for lost lessons or activities or additional expenses incurred if you forget to mention an allergy and it requires finding

another home and host teacher. If no home or host teacher can be found for your remaining stay, there will be no refund.

No-Smoking.

This is not that difficult to accommodate. Host teachers and their families will not smoke inside the home, but cannot require that friends, tradesmen, deliverymen, etc. visiting the host's home not smoke. Outside the United States, more people smoke; however, the number of smokers in most countries is decreasing each year.

Special Diets.

- •If you request a special diet, every effort will be made to arrange it for you.
- •If you require a special diet for health reasons, you can, in most cases, be accommodated. There may possibly be an additional charge, depending upon the type of diet requested and the additional cost to the host teacher or additional



time required to prepare this for you. The host teacher cannot be expected to provide the services of a dietician.

- •If you are a vegetarian, this is not a problem. You might go to the home of a host teacher who is a vegetarian, or to one who will not be upset if you only eat what you want and not eat everything he/she prepares. You will be served larger quantities of what you can eat.
- •If you request a special diet, and request to be in a homestay where everyone else follows the same diet (i.e., vegetarian) or that special meals be prepared for you, you are severely limiting your options.

Private Bedrooms.

You will always have your own bedroom, unless two people come to study together. If two people come together and want separate / individual rooms in the same home, you might be limiting your options, and there may be an additional charge. More hosts have one bedroom available than have two bedrooms available

Private Bathrooms.

- •In the United States, there is a much higher ratio of bathrooms to bedrooms and other rooms in the home than there is anywhere else in the world. The entire family (host family and student) will not be sharing the same bathroom unless, possibly, there is only one person, or maximum two people, in the host family. Although it definitely can be done, it may sometimes, during the summer, be difficult to find a home where a student can have his/her own private bathroom.
- •Do not judge the standard of living of a home in another country by the number of bathrooms. Most homes in the United States and the rest of the Americas are much more recently constructed than those in Europe. Many of the elegant homes in Europe are 100 to 200 years old and older. Putting in additional bathrooms requires making structural, and possibly architectural, changes or possibly installing a whole new plumbing system. These changes may not be permitted by zoning laws and historical preservation restrictions.
- •If you insist on a private bathroom, you will be limiting your choice of host teachers.

• Private Bathroom Supplement:

- If you want a private bathroom guaranteed (Private Bathroom Essential) on the Standard Program, there might be an cost supplement. This would usually be applied in the peak season or for applications received less than 4 weeks before the starting date. We try not to charge this but sometimes it is necessary.
- The Supplement is charged only once, per bathroom not per person. It is the same cost for one or two people in a home.
- In some countries, there usually will be no additional charge for a private bathroom.

Mutual Interests.

- Every effort is made to try to match students and hosts as to general interests. If requests are made at the last moment, or if requests are highly specialized, they can sometimes be difficult to fulfill.
- •Matching an interest in literature, does not mean, under normal circumstances, finding someone who is, for example, a specialist in the Literature of the Golden Age in Spain or the works of Montesquieu in France. Same thing with sports. It would mean matching you with someone with a good overall knowledge of the literature of the country or with good overall knowledge of the particular sport, but not with a specialist in literature or in the sport. The same holds true for art, music, gardening, etc.

Standard Of Living.

The difference in category is one of life style; not quality of teaching. Each country has its idiosyncrasies. The categories are determined by each R / LO. The decision is based on experience, instinct and intuition; not on a list of criteria that must be met.

•Standard & Standard Plus Category:

Most homes are upper middle income and upper income. Occasionally, even if the circumstances are more modest, middle-income homes are used when it is believed that the host teacher is especially good.

• Business / Professional Category:

- When a Special Vocabulary is requested, host teachers are chosen who are knowledgeable in the specialized vocabulary requested.
- The standard of living of the host teachers in the Business / Professional Category would never be lower than that of the Standard Category, and in most cases would be superior to it.
- We are preparing another version of this brochure for those who want to take the program for Business or Professional reasons. You might want to request it.
- "Luxury" Category: Households are usually high income. However, in Europe especially, emphasis is placed on tradition. A "maison particuleir," without central air-conditioning, but with huge shutters to keep out the sun, or an estate in England without central heating, that is rather cold and drafty in winter, but does have a fireplace in every room, is considered more prestigious and more deluxe than a modern apartment with all the modern conveniences.

June, July, August To Mid-September.

Just to reiterate... These are the months of the year with the highest number of participants. If you want to attend at this time of year, please try to submit applications early. Please be patient. Often, addresses will not come until right before the program is to start. Your region will be confirmed in advance. This does not mean that no one knows where you are going. It means that the name of the host will not be given out until it is almost definite there will be no last minute change. If one person changes his / her plans during a busy time of year, it can set off a chain reaction resulting in many changes. Therefore, it is better not to release the name and address until, in all probability, there will be no last minute changes.

Last Minute Changes In Host Family.

This usually does not occur, but because the program involves individuals, not large hotels, it is always

possible that this could happen. If this does, students are expected to / must accept this change. There is also the chance that a change will made at the last moment if a host believed to be more suited to the student's needs becomes available.

Ability To Adjust.

•You will be living in the home of someone you do not know, in a foreign country with cultural differences. You will like some things; you will not like others. You are there to appre-

ciate what is different, not to look for the similarities.

Things are not supposed to be like at home; that is one of the reasons you are participating in this program.

- •If you are apprehensive about your ability to adjust, please think twice about enrolling.
- Parents, please make sure your children understand this.



Typical Host Teacher, Host Family And Host Home.

- •There is none. It is a cross-section of the population. The one characteristic they all have in common is that they are all educated, native speakers of the language and enjoy teaching and enjoy meeting people.
- •There are traditional family units, with mother, father and children at home. There are also: divorced women with children; divorced men; single women; single men; widows;

widowers; retired couples; young recent college graduates, etc.

•Special Requests: You can request female only host families, male only host teachers, no children, etc., etc.



Transfers / Airport & Train Pick-Up Service.

- •Participants may make their way on their own to the host's home from the airport or train station. They may also request to be picked-up at the airport or train station or bus station. If you want this Transfer Service, it can be arranged. In some cases, the host will meet you halfway.
- If you want the Transfer Service, you must request it at least ten (10) days in advance.

Time Of Arrival At The Home Of The Host.

- •If you are not requesting the Transfer Service, it is much better if you discuss your arrival directly with the host. Otherwise, the information has to go through a minimum of three (3) people before it gets to the host. The probability of error is increased.
- •If your language skills are not good enough to call the host directly and your native language is English, call the R / LO who will give you advice on what to do locally.

Visas & Other Documentation.

Passports & Visas, Etc.: You are responsible for obtaining these. When necessary, we will provide the documentation needed.

The "Almost" 100% Total Language Immersion.

- •The "Almost" has been created for those who like the idea of 100-TLI but are really apprehensive about living with strangers or are travelling with someone who for some other reason does not need or want a homestay.
- •It is the same program, but you provide your own lodging and go to the home of the host and spend the day with the host.
- •The cost is the same as the 100-TLI. The reason it is the same cost even though you are not paying for lodging is that for a host teacher, it is much easier to provide lessons and attention to someone living in the home with a more flexible schedule than it is for someone coming to the home for the day with a fixed schedule.

Costs.

• The costs for each country take into consideration a number of factors. In addition to the costs for the program (lessons, lodging & meals), they include, but are not limited to, fluctuating currencies worldwide and probable inflation in some countries, the idiosyncrasies of setting up programs in each country (time zones, cultural differences), etc. The U.K. and Europe have a long tradition of language study and homestays, therefore it is easier and less expensive comparatively to organize this program in those countries than it is in so-called lesser developed countries or in countries where less commonly taught languages are spoken. Therefore, the final cost of the program is not always related to the standard of living of the country. In some countries, there is administrative work related to obtaining Visas that has to

be done by the Local Organizer and that is also reflected in the cost.

- •For the 100-TLI to be successful, a number of people may be involved in setting up each homestay. The cost reflects this.
- The costs are printed in the brochure. There are pages for ONE Student in a homestay and pages for TWO students in a homestay.
- •If more than TWO people will be coming together or parents will come with children, please ask for a special quote.

• Cost Includes:

- number of lessons
- teaching materials
- lodging
- 3 meals each day
- when requested, airport or train station or bus station pick-up and return
- laundry (within reason, no dry cleaning)
- one activity day per week
- additional time the host spends with the student

•Standard Category:

Everything listed under "Cost Includes."

•Standard Plus Category:

Everything listed under "Cost Includes" Private Bathroom

•Business Category:

Everything listed under "Cost Includes"

- ·Private Bathroom
- ·Specialized Vocabulary, if requested
- Business or professional related contact/s if requested. Must be specified in advance.

•Luxury Category:

Everything listed under "Cost Includes"

- ·Private Bathroom
- ·Superior Accommodations and Lifestyle.
- ·Specialized Vocabulary, if requested
- ·Business or professional related contact/s if requested. Must be specified in advance.
- ·Social Contacts

• Cost Does NOT Include*:

- Tickets to movies, theater, sports events, fees to play tennis or golf, etc. if this is done with host teacher. Since there are so many possibilities, it is difficult to include them in the cost.
- •Meals if host-teacher takes student on an activity that does not permit returning to the home to eat. Once again, there are so many possibilities, it is impossible





to include all options in the cost.

- •Christmas and New Year's Supplements in some countries
- *If student requests and arranges for and pays for a Leisure, Cultural or Sports Activity Program in advance, these items might be included in the cost. Each program is different.

• Final Costs: :

The listed costs are considered final costs. Due to possible currency exchange rate fluctuations (especially with the present instability of the U.S. Dollar) these costs may have to be revised. Once you pay in full (not just the deposit) for the cost in effect at the time you pay, the cost will not be increased. This holds true no matter how far in advance you pay in full.

•Special Costs: (The most common ones.)

- •For those accompanying people taking lessons, but who do not want lessons themselves.
- •For children accompanying adults who are taking lessons.
- •For adults accompanying children who are taking lessons.
- •For Special Diets.
- •For preparing for Special Exams.

• Change of Date / Plans Fee:

There might be a \$200.00 "Change of Date / Plans Fee" if the Starting Date or Location is changed less than one month in advance. It will depend on the circumstances of the individual application, country and time of year... and ease of making the change.

100% Total Language Immersion for Executives & Professionals.

- •The 100-TLI method has been a favorite of Senior Level Executives and Professionals in Europe for over 30 years. You do not need to be concerned about the quality of the teachers or the quality of the homestays.
- You have the choice of four (4) categories of homestays.
- Special vocabularies to meet the needs of many industries and professions are available.
- •If you request to be placed with a host teacher with a knowledge of economic or banking terminology, etc., you will be placed with someone knowledgeable in the vocabulary of, but not an expert in, the specific field. Your host-teacher, in all probability, will not be an economist or banker, but someone with contacts (friends or relatives) who are economists or bankers. The primary purpose of "100%-TLI" is language skill acquisition.

•If you are or your company is "going global" you need to first be successful on a one-to-one basis with your potential clients. Cultural Preparedness is part

of the program. Being Culturally Prepared is one step beyond Business Etiquette.

•You may also want to consider the "Almost" 100% Total Language Immersion if you are not enthusiastic about



living in the home of someone you do not know. Information on this is at the end of this section.

Parents Bringing Children / Child Care.

- If you are bring a child, you must let us know in advance.
- •Parents cannot expect a member of the host family to baby-sit or entertain their children during their own language lessons, unless this is agreed to in advance. They also cannot expect the host to baby-sit or entertain children free of charge while they go out for the evening or go sightseeing. Any costs for childcare are the expense of the participant.

Seniors with Health Considerations.

- This is an excellent program for Seniors who are apprehensive about going to a foreign country because of what might happen.
- •You will know where you will be in advance. In advance of your stay, you can identify doctors, specialists, hospitals, pharmacies that you might need in an emergency. You will be prepared.
- Special Diets can be requested.
- •You may be travelling alone, but once you arrive, you will be with your host. There is no need to fear being stranded in a place you do not know with people you do not know.
- •Many activities that are available along with the language lessons, like cooking classes and visiting art galleries and walking are stress free and require a minimum of exertion.

100% Total Language Immersion for Younger Students (8 to 18 Years).

•As previously stated, 100-TLI is an excellent language learning experience for the younger student, both for the good language student who wants to improve his/her skills and for the not-so-good language student who might learn more quickly in a non-classroom situation.

- •The younger student, isolated from speaking and hearing his/her mother tongue, can make considerable progress in a short time. Not only can a student acquire near fluency in the chosen language, but he/she can also acquire a near perfect accent. This becomes more difficult with age.
- •In Europe, students of all ages participate. Up to now, the majority of Americans (North & South) who have participated have been adults.
- •All texts and materials and daily activities will be age appropriate and representative of the country in which the student is studying.
- •There is also the safety factor... While no one anywhere can guarantee that nothing will happen to a child (even in their own home), parents can be reassured that their daughter/son will be carefully placed with a qualified host teacher and responsible adult who is experienced in caring for and supervising younger students. In most cases the person is presently a parent or grandparent.
- •Children are much more individualistic in their language requirements than most adults. An important advantage of living in the home of the host teacher is that the curriculum is planned around the needs of the particular student.
- •Many factors need to be taken into consideration when selecting the appropriate host-teacher for the younger student. Some students have little aptitude for language learning and need a host-teacher with patience; others have a talent for it. Some students are shy and need a host-teacher who will encourage them to participate in conversations and activities; some are outgoing. Some prefer sports; others prefer reading and music. Some students prefer to be in homes with other children their own age; others prefer to be the only child in the home and to be the center of attention.
- •Younger students who are at Beginning and Elementary Levels will be placed with a host-teacher who has a knowledge of English so they will not feel totally lost.
- •While the 100-TLI is for students who might not be good language students, it is not for students with a negative attitude towards learning a foreign language.
- •Students with mild learning disabilities are welcome. However, the student and the parent must realize that the 100-TLI host teachers are not experienced in teaching students with learning disabilities. If a student has a learning disability we will accommodate the student, but they will be treated as others are treated.

- •When requested, children are placed in homes with other children of the same age. If this is not possible, they are placed with hosts / teachers who enjoy children and will introduce them to children in the neighborhood.
- •In some situations, children are encouraged to join local sports or activity clubs to meet children their age in a natural setting.
- •Please make sure that your child wants to participate. If a child is sent against his/her will, no matter how good or friendly the host teacher, absolutely nothing the host teacher can do will make the child happy.
- •The less telephone and e-mail contact children have with parents and friends, the better. Children will adjust more quickly to their "new life." However, if there are problems, we do want to hear about them.
- •There may be an additional charge for students under 18. It will depend on the level of supervision requested by the parent/s.
- If a student has special materials that he / she wants to use for lessons, that will be permitted as long as the host teacher is informed of this in advance and is able to evaluate the materials.

Children under 18 / Notarized Release Letter:

- •Children under the age of 18 who are traveling unaccompanied may need a Notarized Release Letter, signed by one or both parents. This depends upon the airline and the country to which you will be traveling. It is always subject to change and is enforced sporadically and arbitrarily (a personal opinion).
- •Children under 18 traveling with just one parent or an adult other than a parent might also need this Notarized Release Letter.
- •It is the responsibility of the parent or other adult to check on the Notarized Release Letter that is required by the chosen airline and what the letter is to contain (it is a very simple letter). If your child is required to have one and does not have one, any days or any other part of the program lost cannot be recuperated and will be forfeited. This is information only the airline can provide.

Terms & Conditions

The Language Study Homestays International / 100% Total Language Immersion Program is first and foremost a language study program. It is not a program for those for whom the first priority is sightseeing or shopping, etc.

In most countries, Language Study Homestays International / 100% Total Language Immersion (abbreviated "100-TLI") arranges homestays in conjunction with the organization that first introduced the Language Study Homestays concept. In other countries it is set up in conjunction with very reputable language institutes. These are collectively abbreviated as "PROGRAMS" in the Terms & Conditions

"100-TLI" and 'PROGRAMS" consider the choice of an appropriate host-teacher to be more important than placing a student in a specific city or region and reserves the right to place participants in another region if there is no compatible hostteacher in the region selected. If the location is very important, this must be stated when application is submitted. Every effort will be made to accommodate special requests. During certain months (usually summer), it cannot be guaranteed. If you change your destination after the hostteacher is assigned, there will be a fee for changing the destination. Absolutely, no changes in location will be made after arrival at the home of the host teacher / destination because of preference for another city / region.

Once the participant is with the host-teacher, if there are any problems with the lessons or with the homestay, the participant should contact the Regional / Local Organizer (abbreviated "R/LO") at once. Problems involving refunds must be stated in writing at the time the problem occurs, before departure from the home of the host teacher. Both "R/LO" and participant must sign request for refund. Neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor Louise Harber (abbreviated "LH") will in any way be responsible for resolving any refund problem that is not stated in writing to the "R/LO" and "PROGRAMS" and / or "100-TLI" or "LH" at the time the problem occurs, before the departure from the home of the host teacher. Where and whom to contact will depend upon where one is studying. That information appears on the page giving the name and address and additional information on the host-teacher. If there is any question about whom to contact, please contact "100-TLI" at the time the problem occurs.

Neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" will knowingly send participants to any area where there is any danger or risk to participant, other than the dangers or risks encountered in normal everyday life. However, the world situation changes very rapidly; and there is no guarantee that what is safe today, will be safe tomorrow. Therefore, before submitting Deposit, please make sure that you definitely want to participate or that you want your child/ren to participate. Absolutely no refunds will be given because of terrorism (before or during the program), either in the city, region or country where you will be studying or anywhere else in the world, or any other similar circum-

stances. If you have any doubts about traveling in general or to your specific area in particular; please wait to send in the application.

PAYMENTS:

♦ **Deposit.** Must be submitted, with any Late Registration Fees (if applicable), with Application Form.

♦ Final Payment.

- Due five (5) weeks before departure. If payment is not received five (5) weeks before departure, participant may be dropped from program or incur a Late Payment Fee. If you will be paying late for any reason, let "100-TLI" know in advance.
- Payments made less than five (5) weeks before departure must be made by Cashier's Check, Wire Transfer, Travelers Checks or similar.
- Payment must be made in full before program begins. For programs of more than twelve (12) weeks, you may pay for the first twelve (12) weeks, and pay for the remaining weeks six (6) weeks before the first twelve (12) weeks are
- Under no circumstances will payments be accepted upon arrival at the home of the host-teacher.

REFUND POLICIES:

Making sure that your "100-TLI" is what you want it to be, requires a good deal of planning. For each participant who attends, a number of people are involved in the process. It is not as simple as it may appear. Host-teachers (and their families in many instances) make commitments, take vacations, etc. based on the fact that they will have someone in their home. Cancellations affect many people. The more advance notice that you give, the better it will be for you and for all concerned. The following Refund Policies apply to participants of all ages (no exceptions).

- **♦ Deposit:** The Deposit is Non-Refundable, with two exceptions.
- 1) If arrangements cannot be made for the participant on the dates he / she is able to attend. However, if arrangements can be made for the dates requested in the country of choice and the participant changes the dates and arrangements cannot be made for the new dates, there will be no refund of Deposit.
- 2) If "100-TLI" believes that the participant is not choosing the correct program or category for what he / she wants to accomplish or is expecting to accomplish too much in a short period of time.
- If Notification of Cancellation is given five (5) weeks or more before the "100-TLI" program begins, the Deposit will be credited to future participation in the "100-TLI" Program. If Notification of Cancellation is given less than five (5) weeks or less in advance of starting date, the Deposit will be forfeited.
- ♦ Cancellation of Program (See also "Postponement"):

O Before the Program Begins.

- Except for any Special Arrangements (see below), the following are the Maximum Penalties for Cancellation. (see "POSTPONE-MENTS") Extenuating Circumstances for additional refunds will be the decision of "PROGRAMS," not "100-TLI" or "LH."

- Notice given more than 35 days before "100-TLI" Program begins: 100% of Final Payment less Deposit will be refunded.
- Notice given between 35 days and 29 days before "100-TLI" Program begins; the total for one week + Deposit will not be refunded.
- Notice given between 28 days and 18 days before "100-TLI" Program begins, a total of two weeks + Deposit will not be refunded.
- Notice given between 17 days and 8 days before "100-TLI" Program begins, the total of the first three weeks of the program will not be refunded.
- If notice is given 7 days or less before "100-TLI" Program begins, the Cancellation Penalty will be at least the cost of the program for four weeks. If the program is less than four weeks, the entire amount will be for
- If special / difficult requests (i.e.; diet, professional interests, region, country, etc.) were involved or if any Special Arrangements (i.e.; airfare, hotel, etc.) have been made, and any monies have been expended, penalties for cancellation of these will be apart from and in addition to the penalties for cancellation of the "100-TLI" program. The penalties for cancellation of a special host-teacher (usually for the Business category or "5-Star" category), airfare, hotels, etc. will be according to the contract with the special host-teacher or the regulations set down by the airline, hotel, etc. This paragraph holds true no matter how far in advance the notice of cancellation is received.

O After the Program Begins:

- No refunds will be made for stays of four (4) weeks or less, except perhaps in the case of certifiable medical reasons. Amount to be refunded in such a situation will be entirely the decision of "PROGRAMS" and not that of "100-TLI" or "LH" and will take into account arrangements that have been made. If a refund is denied by "PROGRAMS" students cannot look to "100-TLI" or "LH" to give a refund.
- Refunds for programs of longer than five (5) weeks will be given only if Notification of Cancellation is received in writing by the "R/LO" two (2) or more weeks (14 days or more) before the beginning of the 3rd week of the program.
- All cancellations after five (5) weeks will be subject to a Cancellation Penalty of 10%.
- You are advised to purchase Trip Cancellation Insurance. Trip Cancellation Insurance must be purchased through your Travel Agent or Airline. "100-TLI" is not a travel agent and is not able to provide this service.

POSTPONEMENT OF PROGRAM. If you

Postpone your stay, and do not Cancel it, and do not request a Refund, the Penalties will be considerably less. The only exception might be if the Postponement is made less than 15 days before the program is to begin. If, at a later date, you Cancel and request a Refund, the Postponement will be considered a Cancellation and refunds will be made as if the date of notification of Postponement was the date of notification of the Cancellation.

LATE ARRIVALS:

♦ If you arrive later (hours or days) than expected, for whatever reason, you will not receive any

refund for any lessons or lodging that has been missed

- ♦ If you have given advance notification of the Late Arrival, every attempt will be made to readjust the schedule to recuperate lessons. In the event this is not possible, there will be no refunds for what cannot be recuperated.
- ♦ If you do not notify anyone about the Late Arrival, even if the change was due to circumstances beyond your control, neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" has any obligation to recuperate lost lessons or activities.

INSURANCE: Insurance against cancellation, accident, illness or loss of property is the sole responsibility of the participant. Neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" will accept liability for changes in program or inconveniences due to strikes, inclement weather, terrorism, "force majeure" or any other circumstances beyond its / their control. Personal Insurance, Medical Insurance and Trip Cancellation Insurance are strongly recommended.

ILLNESS, ETC. OF HOST-TEACHER: In the event that, once the participant is at the hostteacher's home and for whatever personal reason of the host-teacher (illness, family obligations, etc.), the host-teacher is not able to complete the program, it is the responsibility of "PROGRAMS" to find another host-teacher. Any expenses incurred will be paid by "PROGRAMS." If hotel or similar arrangements are required, the "R/LO" will make the arrangements. If transportation is required, the "R/LO" will make the arrangements. If participant makes his / her own hotel or travel arrangements. he / she will not be reimbursed by "100-TLI" or "PROGRAMS" or "LH" unless "R/LO" has given instructions to do so. If it is not possible to find another host-teacher, the participant will be refunded the unused portion of the program with no penalties. Neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" will be responsible for expenses past the Refund of the unused portion of the program. All concerned will try to find an alternative choice that is acceptable to the participant, but neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" will be responsible for any expenses such as, but not limited to, airfare, hotels, etc. after the change in plans if the participant refuses to accept the alternate arrangements or if no alternate arrangements can be made. Once again, Trip Cancellation Insurance is recommended.

HOST-TEACHER. As stated under

Qualifications of Host-Teacher, there will be a few exceptions when the teacher will not be the host and will be someone coming into the home. This is not to be considered a reason to request a Refund as the homestay will be arranged to meet the student's requirements and the teacher will be selected to meet the student's requirements. The student will not be receiving anything less that he / she would be receiving under normal circumstances.

LIABILITY:

♦ Neither "100-TLI" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "LH" will accept liability for any loss or damage to possessions, or for any accident or any personal injury incurred by participant, either in the home of the host-teacher or on any activities (personal or business) with the host-teacher, or with

relatives, friends or contacts of the host-teacher or on the trip from the United States or Canada or any other country to the program, or on the return to the U.S. or Canada or any other country from the program. (See INSURANCE above.)

♦ Neither the host, nor the "R/LO," nor "PRO-GRAMS," nor "100-TLI" nor "LH" can be held responsible if you make any purchases at a place suggested by any one involved in "100-TLI" and later, for whatever reason, you are not happy with the purchase. (See INSURANCE above.)

HEALTH:

- ♦ It is understood that all participants be in reasonably good health; and that all health problems (physical and emotional) be under control with proper medication. The need for a Special Diet must be stated in writing on the application. Other than providing a Special Diet, host-teachers are not to be put in the position of having to care for any participant, other than normal attention that would be given to a guest in one's home. If participant requests a Special Diet and, for whatever reason, it is not prepared properly, neither the host nor "R/LO" or "PROGRAMS" nor "100-TLI" nor "LH" may be held responsible for the consequences. The host cannot take on the responsibilities of a dietician.
- ♦ If participant always takes or occasionally takes prescription medication, he / she should take a supply for the entire period that he / she will be away from home. It is often difficult to get the same prescription in another country. While every effort will be made to assist participant in obtaining medication in an emergency, neither the host-teacher nor the "R/LO" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "100-TLI" nor "LH" nor anyone else can be held responsible for the consequences if it is impossible to find the medication or a similar one.
- ♦ If there is a chance that you will need a physician or a specialist while you are traveling, it is suggested that your own physician or specialist get a list of physicians / hospitals / specialists in the countries / regions you will be visiting. There are international medical associations and societies that can provide this. Your physician should know whom to contact to obtain this information. Every effort will be made to help participant to obtain medical assistance in an emergency. Neither the host-teacher nor the "R/LO" nor "PROGRAMS" nor "100-TLI" nor "LH" nor anyone else can be held responsible for the consequences if it is impossible to find a suitable physician or specialist in an emergency.
- ♦ Host-teacher and / or host family has the right to ask a participant to leave the home if he / she believes the participant needs more professional medical attention (physical / emotional) that he / she is able to provide.

CHOICE OF CATEGORY: No refunds will be given if, upon arrival at the home of the host-teacher or after being there for part of the program, you decide you want a different Category.

BEHAVIOR:

- ♦ It is understood that all participants of all ages will behave properly in the home of the host-teacher.
- ♦ If the host-teacher or host family requests that a participant of any age, leave his / her home for any reason related to improper behavior, all addi-

- tional expenses related to this including, but not limited to, getting back to the participants home again, will be the sole responsibility of the participant or parents or legal guardian of the participant. Neither the participant, nor the parents nor the legal guardian nor anyone else, will be reimbursed in any way what-so-ever for additional expenses incurred because of being asked to leave.
- ◆ Participant, or parents or legal guardian, will be responsible for any and all damages caused by participant.
- ♦ Depending upon the reason the participant was asked to leave, it will be the decision of the "R/LO" or "PROGRAMS" as to whether or not a new host-teacher is to be provided.
- ♦ At no time will a minor, under 18, be left to find his / her own lodging, unless permission is received from a parent or legal guardian for him / her to do so.
- ♦ The "R/LO" or "PROGRAMS" will be the ones to decide if any refund for the unused portion of the program is to be made. Neither "100-TLI" nor "LH" will be held responsible for making any refunds not authorized by the "R/LO" or "PROGRAMS." The refund will depend upon the length of stay. The absolute minimum penalty will be the cost of one additional week plus the unused portion of the week in which the participant was asked to leave.

Except in the case of severe illness, accident or injury, it will be the participant's decision as to whether or not a parent is to be notified in the event of illness, accident or injury. Younger participants are carefully placed with host-teachers that enjoy taking younger participants. Younger children will be subject to the rules and regulations of the host-teacher. The rules and regulations must be followed, even if they are stricter than the ones they would have to follow in their own home. They must remember that they are foreigners in a country where they are learning the language. Some host-teachers might be overly protective, usually with good rea-
